

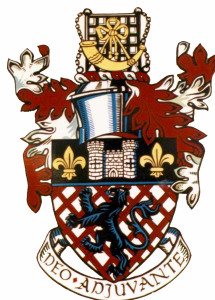

9	To Receive a Report from the Climate Change Working Group Climate Change Emergency Group report 13th May 2021 (appendix 8) The Climate Emergency Chair (Cllr John Latter) has requested that the agenda item be considered by the July full council meeting to get the resolution passed for the Plastics Free Community Status. The 3 points to be agreed are as follows: (The wording in bold is the actual motion as it needs to be agreed, the wording in the brackets to provide more information.)

	1. The council agrees to put a member on your steering committee. (The Steering committee will be led by members of the Climate Emergency Working Group and engage with T&W registered climate change champions). 2. The council agrees to support ‘Plastic Free Communities’ initiatives in the area. (The Climate Emergency Working Group, with the steering group / climate change champions will work to support local and all national “Plastic Free Communities” initiatives). 3. The council pledges to act by example and remove single-use items from its premises. (The Climate Emergency Working Group, will seek to impart knowledge to local residents and businesses in order to support and collaborate in reducing single use plastics across our town). 10	Motion to Full Council - Proposed by Cllr Lee Carter (College Ward) <i>“This Council opposes the closure of Barclays Bank Branch in Wellington. At a time of increasing positivity and investment in our local High Street this is backward step by Barclays disenfranchising many residents and businesses from access to basic banking services.</i> <i>This Council will write to Barclays to express its views and urge them to reconsider.</i> <i>This Council urges Mark Pritchard MP to write to Barclays and ask Barclays to reconsider and for him to report to this Council on progress.”</i> Motion Seconded by, Cllr Angela McClements (Arlestone), and supported by Cllr Graham Cook (Haygate) Cllr Joan Gorse (Arlestone), Cllr Giles Luter (Arlestone) Cllr John Latter (College), Cllr Usman Ahmed (College) Cllr Julie Pierce (Park), Cllr Paul Davis (Park) and Cllr Crispin Barker (Haygate).
11	The Armed Forces Covenant (appendix 10) – Council to consider a pledge to acknowledge and understand the needs of the Armed Forces community and to ensure that they are treated with fairness and respect in all aspects of their life. When signing the Armed Forces Covenant, Wellington Town Council will demonstrate its public commitment to the Armed Forces community by agreeing to two core principles: No member of the Armed Forces community should face disadvantage in the provision of public and commercial services compared to any other citizen. In some circumstances, special treatment may be appropriate, especially for the injured or bereaved.
